



GRAMPIANS MUSIC FESTIVAL MENTORING PROGRAM

WHAT IS IT?

The Grampians Music Festival Mentoring Program is a three month initiative that gives you the chance to work alongside the Grampians Music Festival Committee to learn about a range of career opportunities within the music events industry.

You will join in fortnightly committee meetings and participate in working group discussions about your chosen career path.

The program runs from the 1st of November, 2017 to the conclusion of the festival on Sunday 4th February, 2018.

WHAT CAREER AREAS ARE AVAILABLE?

You're able to apply for one of five different career streams within the committee. Those are:

- **Event Management**
Get to see how an event is run from a logistical point of view. Understand the importance of time management, a sound project plan and why quality documentation is important. Learn how Event Management becomes the corner stone of any well run event
- **Marketing and Public Relations**
Find out about how a marketing plan was created, what a target audience is and how to liaise with designers, suppliers and stakeholders. This team gets the word out about what the festival is, why to come along and how to buy tickets.
- **Finance**
You can't do anything without money! Learn about the importance of the Festival budget, the rules that govern how people spend and how we make decisions on what can and can't be sent.
- **Artist Management**
Lots of bands mean lots of moving parts. You can help create Artist Work Sheets, compile band sound production, help manage their accommodation needs and how we get our bands to where we need them to be.
- **Volunteer Management**
At the heart of any great festival is its volunteers. However, recruiting and managing those volunteers is a big job! Find out about how volunteers are chosen, rosters are created and everyone is kept informed!

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

To take part in the Grampians Music Festival Mentor program, you must live in the Northern Grampians Shire Council. You must also be aged between 17 and 21 years of age.

You must be able to commit to attend at least 80% of the fortnightly meetings between 1 November 2017 and 4 February 2018. You must also be available to help onsite at the Festival from 2 – 4 February 2018.
